

NOTICE OF SPECIAL INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 284 (WAYZATA PUBLIC SCHOOLS) STATE OF MN

Notice is hereby given that a special election has been called and will be held in and for Independent School District No. 284 (Wayzata Public Schools), State of MN, on Tuesday, April 14, 2026, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. for the purpose of voting on the following questions:

SCHOOL DISTRICT QUESTION 1

Renewal of Expiring Capital Project Levy for Technology

The board of Independent School District No. 284 (Wayzata Public Schools), Minnesota has proposed to renew its capital project levy, scheduled to expire after taxes payable in 2029, in the maximum amount of 2.66075% times the net tax capacity of the school district to provide funds for the purchase and installation of software and technology equipment and the support and maintenance of technology. The proposed tax rate is not being increased from the previous year's rate. The proposed renewal of the expiring capital project levy authorization will raise approximately \$7,039,362 for taxes first levied in 2029, payable in 2030, and will be authorized for ten (10) years. The estimated total cost of the projects to be funded over that time period is approximately \$70,393,620.

YES Shall the renewal of the expiring capital project levy authorization to fund technology proposed by the board of Independent School District No. 284 (Wayzata Public Schools), Minnesota be approved?

BY VOTING "YES" ON THIS BALLOT QUESTION, YOU ARE VOTING TO RENEW AN EXISTING CAPITAL PROJECTS REFERENDUM THAT IS SCHEDULED TO EXPIRE.

This is the renewal of an existing technology levy, approved by voters, that funds technology equipment, support, software and training districtwide.

This is a renewal only and will not increase taxes beyond current levels.

SCHOOL DISTRICT QUESTION 2

Approval of School Building Bonds

YES Shall the board of Independent School District No. 284 (Wayzata Public Schools), Minnesota be authorized to issue general obligation school building bonds in an amount not to exceed \$465,000,000 for acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities including, but not limited to, a new elementary school, a new middle school, an addition to Wayzata High School, safety and security improvements and various other capital projects districtwide?

BY VOTING "YES" ON THIS BALLOT QUESTION, YOU ARE VOTING FOR A PROPERTY TAX INCREASE.

Voters must approve bond funds for major building projects.

These funds would build a new elementary school, a new middle school, a high school addition, and essential improvements to existing schools to serve the district's growing resident student population.

The tax increase on the average homeowner would be \$29/month. A tax calculator is available at vote.wayzataschools.org.

Approval of School Building Bonds

If School District Question 2 is approved, shall the board of Independent School District No. 284 (Wayzata Public Schools), Minnesota be authorized to issue general obligation school building bonds in an amount not to exceed \$31,000,000 for acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities including, but not limited to, construction of an 8-lane swimming and diving pool?

BY VOTING "YES" ON THIS BALLOT QUESTION, YOU ARE VOTING FOR A PROPERTY TAX INCREASE.

These funds would be used to build a 8-lane competition pool with a diving well on the Wayzata High School campus. This request is contingent on the approval of question 2.

The tax increase on the average homeowner would be \$4/month. A tax calculator is available at vote.wayzataschools.org.

*Estimated tax impact includes principal and interest payments on the new bonds, other capital and debt service levies, and capital project levies only, and do not include tax levies for other purposes. The amounts in the table are based on school district taxes for bonded debt levies only, and do not include tax levies for other purposes. Tax increases shown above are gross increases, not including the impact of the homeowner's Homestead Credit Refund ("Circuit Breaker") program. Owners of homestead property may qualify for a refund, based on their income and total property taxes. This will change the net effect of the proposed bond issue for those property owners.

For commercial-industrial property, the estimates above are for property in the City of Wayzata. The tax impact for commercial-industrial property in other municipalities in the school district may be slightly different, due to the varying impact of the Fiscal Disparities program.

This combined polling place serves all territories in Independent School District No. 284 located in the City of Maple Grove, Precincts 11 and 12; City of Medicine Lake, Precinct 1; the City of Plymouth, Ward 1, Precincts 2, 3 and 5; the City of Plymouth, Ward 2, Precinct 8; the City of Plymouth, Ward 3, Precincts 11, 13, 15, and 16; the City of Plymouth Ward 4, Precinct 17; the City of Minnetonka, Ward 2, Precincts 2A and 2B; the City of Minnetonka, Ward 3, Precinct 3A; Hennepin County, MN.

Wayzata City Hall, 600 Rice Street, Wayzata, MN

This combined polling place serves all territories in Independent School District No. 284 located in the City of Orono, Precinct 2; The City of Wayzata, Precinct 1; the City of Plymouth, Ward 2, Precincts 9 and 10; The City of Minnetonka, Ward 3, Precincts 3B and 3C; Hennepin County, MN.

Wayzata Public Schools Creekside Building, 16000 41st Avenue North,

Plymouth, MN

This combined polling place serves all territories in Independent School District No. 284 located in the City of Plymouth, Ward 2, Precincts 6 and 7; Hennepin County, MN.

Early voting for all polling locations will take place February 27-April 13 at the Wayzata Public Schools District Service Center, 13305 12th Avenue North, Plymouth, MN.


Early voting hours: 7:30 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday-Friday, and 9 a.m.-3 p.m. on Saturday, April 11.
